


Hockessin Children's Area

History:

Hockessin's first library service began in 1952 when the bookmobile was introduced to the town. In 1977, the Hockessin Public Library opened in the Lamborn Library Building. And just three short years later, the growing children's library was relocated in an expanded second floor.


By 1989, service had expanded dramatically and the Hockessin Public Library became part of the New Castle County Department of Libraries. As the Hockessin area continued to grow, so did membership in the library. In 1994, a new library was built at 1023 Valley Road.

The library truly acts as a center for the Hockessin community, which is a suburban, unincorporated area. Many programs and services attract members of all ages from the pre-school to the senior populations.

General Description:

The Hockessin Library is located in a park setting and is less visible than might be ideal; nevertheless, usage of the building is extremely heavy. Ample off-street parking is provided although it may be necessary to use some of this space in order to expand the building. The interior of the Library is bright and pleasant. The facility is well organized but virtually every area is near or beyond capacity.
