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
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# **OVERVIEW**

Exciting changes have been occurring at public libraries in Delaware since the last Statewide Master Plan in 2005, transforming how patrons interact with their local libraries, how librarians serve their constituents and how the library system operates.

As the libraries continue to evolve, the mission statement continues to hold true and serve as the guiding principle for all efforts:

"The dream of Delaware Libraries is to help our state become an even more vibrant and prosperous place where all dreams are realized."

# **PURPOSE OF MASTER PLAN**

Taking stock of the successes that have occurred over the past decade, the current Master Plan presents the opportunity to encourage the momentum in areas that have been successful, identify new areas for development and continue to build upon recommendations from the previous Master Plan, the latest Library Services and Technology Act LSTA 2018-2022 and other studies that have been conducted in recent years. While the Master Plan is a flexible document that serves to guide rather than

dictate development and can be adjusted to accommodate specific local needs, the document is intended to provide concrete goals and serve as a roadmap to achieving them over the next ten years.




# **STRUCTURE OF MASTER PLAN**

While the primary focus of the Master Plan is on the physical infrastructure that serves as the backbone of all libraries across the state – namely, facilities – any facility recommendation is inevitably tied to topics related to technology, staffing, collections management, and patron assistance. Although this report delves most extensively into facility analysis and recommendations, it also explores how the facility recommendations impact other aspects of librarianship and patron experience. Thus, the Master Plan comprises three parts:

- Book 1: Statewide Master Plan for Library Services and Construction is an overview of libraries' needs and recommendations across the state;
- Book 2: Ideas Book is a Do-It-Yourself guide to improving the physical condition of Delaware Libraries. This step-by-step manual may be used by library boards, administrators and staff to create libraries that are more welcoming and user-friendly to first-time visitors;
- Professional Development Curriculum comprises multiple lesson plans for improving staff development and is targeted at library administrators.

# **PROCESS**

In February 2017, the Delaware Division of Libraries (DDL)/Council On Libraries (COL) engaged a team of library consultants and specialists to undertake a Statewide Master Plan for Library Services and Construction for the State of Delaware. Over the course of twelve months, the consultant team conducted more than 32 library visits to gain deeper insights into each facility. Regular workshops and conference calls with DDL staff allowed for a collaborative and consultative process between the consultant team, DDL and the Delaware public libraries. Discussions encompassed topics ranging from understanding overall goals and objectives, library operations and management, service locations, funding and many others. Public town hall meetings, which included administrators and staff from various Delaware public libraries and state legislators, allowed the consultant team to provide regular updates on topics such as planning and construction, collections, professional development, future trends in libraries and others. At one presentation, a futurist discussed the role and opportunities for libraries to become an even more integral part of each community. At another, specialists focusing on the professional development of librarians stressed the importance of nurturing a culture of learning across all levels of the library staff.



## FIGURE 1 Delaware Public Libraries

The organization of public libraries in the State of Delaware is illustrated in this diagram. The organization chart depicts the five primary areas including the Council on Libraries; Delaware Division of Libraries; and the library systems within each of the three Counties in the state. There are multiple approaches to library governance structures within each county as outlined on the far-right of the organizational chart. In total there are seven different library structures among the 33 Delaware public libraries.



# LIBRARY SNAPSHOTS

The library snapshots provide important facts about each library's service reach, data about use measurements and recommended improvements. Each library is profiled in a four-page spread with factual information about each facility, photographs of their existing conditions and charts summarizing their performance measures since 2014. By summarizing and bringing together this vital information on library usage across the state, it allows librarians to benchmark themselves against their peers by geography or size. More importantly, this data may provide librarians with insights on how to better serve their communities. These snapshots can be found at the end of this document.

# **1 SF PER CAPITA**

As outlined in the last Statewide Master Plan, the goal of providing 1 SF of library space per capita for the residents of Delaware continues to be a goal in the current Master Plan. Since 2005, there has been an increase of 255,970 SF of library space resulting in 0.65 SF per capita. (Table B) As Delaware's population grows at the rate of approximately 3-4% every 5 years and demand for library services increase, the continued funding and investment in libraries is critical to providing needed services to the residents of the state. Table C summarizes the libraries needing renovation or expansion or areas needing new facilities over the next ten years. When these recommendations are implemented, the available library square foot per capita will increase to 0.72. While these recommendations assist in moving closer to attaining the goal of 1 SF per capita, there remains a lot to accomplish. In the next iteration of the Master Plan, it may be necessary to re-evaluate this goal.

# **THREE TIERS OF LIBRARIES**

The three library types were first proposed in the 2005 Master Plan as a way to address the population sizes and needs at each location and was adopted by the Council on Libraries in 2007.

The smallest type of library is the Community Library and there may be up to ten community libraries in a county depending on population size or growth, transportation network, size of county, etc. The midsized library is the Regional Library, of which there should be at least two per county. Regional libraries have a more extensive collection and programming than Community Libraries. It is recommended that every county have at least one Anchor Library, which is the largest of the three types. This library has the largest and most comprehensive collection in multiple formats, the largest staff, greatest number of professional librarians, most public spaces such as meeting rooms and most active programming.

Organizing libraries into three tiers is still conceptually valid. However, this Master Plan recommends that the minimum sizes of each of the libraries be increased to accommodate new program space needs and reach the needed critical mass to allow for more efficient staffing and operations. Refer to Table D for size comparisons.

# **SPACE PROGRAMS**

As each library embarks upon a new expansion or construction project, an important first step is the space programming or planning of the proposed facility. This typically involves a listing of space types desired in the facility and an associated square footage for each space. While there may be space types that are unique to specific library locales, the following space programs for the three library types serve as guides or benchmarks for libraries considering building projects (Table E). The sample programs list the type of library spaces typically found in a public library, the space standard in square footage terms, and the number of spaces proposed. Referring to these programs, libraries will be able to get a general understanding of the space needs they may have in order to accommodate certain projected activities, collection count or staff size, etc.

# **SPACE LAYOUT DIAGRAM**

The diagram (Figure 3) on the following page, provides a threedimensional illustration of the types of spaces users may desire at a library and how the various spaces could be located in relation to each other.

Collections continue to occupy significant space in all tiers of libraries and mobile shelving that is easily moveable is highly recommended. Seating and computing stations can be interspersed between different sections of the collections to provide some separation. Discrete spaces dedicated to Children's and Teens' collections allow these users to feel that they have their own space.

The provision of public spaces such as meeting rooms for small, medium and large groups afford libraries the flexibility to organize a range of program activities. It also provides partners with a space to establish a temporary presence at the library. Meeting rooms are located at the perimeter to reduce visual obstructions in the middle of the facility, allowing librarians to have clear lines of sight everywhere in the library.


Inspiration Spaces, which are collaborative, creative spaces where librarians and partners provide innovative, forward-looking programming could take a variety of forms such as makerspaces, entrepreneurship centers, technology-enhanced spaces and others.

An exterior landscaped area acts as an extension of the library, providing additional active programming space for events.

# **IMPORTANCE OF FURNITURE SELECTION**

The selection of furniture for libraries is critically important and is ideally undertaken as an integral part of the design process. Furniture is a vital component of a library facility and needs to be holistically considered during the design process. Selecting the appropriate type of furniture allows library spaces to be more fully utilized and functional. Furniture can possess acoustical properties, be movable, include power outlets and be adjustable for people who are sitting or standing. Many pieces of furniture can be used in multiple ways or are reconfigurable, encouraging users to form collaborative workspaces as needed, transforming the space to function for various uses.

# **TEENS/TWEENS**

Designating a corner of the library farthest from the entrance creates a sense of privacy sought after by teens. Design a more dynamic space by varying types of seating, from comfortable lounges to movable furniture.

# CHILDREN'S COLLECTIONS

While computer labs can be freely accessed by patrons during open hours, they may also serve as instructional spaces where digital literacy programs can be held. A service desk could be located nearby to provide users with assistance when needed.

> Color, scale, and flexibility characterize an inviting Children's Area and distinguish it from the rest of the library. Consider utilizing a range of seating, book browsing heights and mobile shelving, which accommodate toddlers, juveniles, and even parents.

# **INSPIRATION SPACE**

Because inspiration spaces, or "makerspaces." are opportunities for patrons to discover and try new things, they are best utilized in proximity to Teen/Tweens and Adult Collections areas.

# CAFE

A cafe, coffee, and/or food component may be ideal in your library. Consider locating this space near the entrance/outdoor space to create a cozy atmosphere.

# **CONFERENCE**/ **MULTI-PURPOSE ROOMS**

Stackable chairs and tables, as well as movable partitions create the flexibility that conference and multi-purpose rooms require.









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# **ADULT COLLECTIONS**

Position mobile stacks strategically, alternating rows running vertical and horizontal, in order to create spaces within which house reading tables, computers, etc. to create both visual and acoustic privacy.

# PUBLIC LOUNGE

It may be necessary to create a central lounge space in your library near the entrance if seating is sparse in your library.

# **SERVICE DESK**

A library's primary service desk is most effective when located directly adjacent to both the lobby and staff area.

# LOBBY

As a patron's first impression of the library, it is vital that this space be inviting, well-lit, and devoid of clutter.

# **OUTDOOR SPACE**

Outdoor lounge and bench seating becomes additional programming space for libraries to hold events and activities, while also providing patrons with a space for gathering and relaxation.



# **STAFF AREAS**

Locating staff in a "corner" of the building increases their view of the library itself. Access to the exterior of the building also provides a location for drive-up check-out and return stations.

# **STORAGE**

Providing storage units for partner agencies alleviates visual clutter in the building.

# SHIPPING/ RECEIVING

A covered loading dock located near the staff area allows librarians to receive, send, and/or stock materials efficiently.

# RESTROOMS

Increase visual access to restrooms by locating them near the building's entrance.







Electrical, heating/cooling, water, and I.T. systems can be located together with both exterior and interior access for convenience.

# PARKING

The 1:200 ratio of parking spaces to gross square feet of library building has proven to be challenging from cost, land use and ecological perspectives. As the use of mass transit, ride and bike sharing initiatives become more widespread, a ratio of 1:300 for all sizes of libraries could be considered. (Table F) Local municipalities may have requirements that need to be considered for any new project.

# **REQUIRED TEAM FOR FACILITIES PLANNING, DESIGN & CONSTRUCTION**

When libraries embark upon a renovation or expansion project or explore the possibility of building a new facility, it is critically important to assemble a team comprising members of the library staff and local community, in conjunction with design and construction professionals. Some key members of the team participating in the planning, design and construction process include:

- Library Director or staff member designated for representing the library;
- DDL facilities representative who has substantial knowledge of project issues and best practices;
- Representatives from the local jurisdiction who is authorized to make commitments on behalf of the jurisdiction;
- Library Building Consultant for Needs Assessment and Building Space Program;

- Architecture and Engineering Team with a strong experience in designing and building libraries (to include architect, engineers, interior design, and construction administration);
- General Contractor or Construction Manager.

To assist libraries in selecting design, engineering and construction professionals, the state may want to consider developing a prequalified list of library consultants, architecture and engineering professionals and contractors/construction managers.

# IMPLICATIONS OF IMPLEMENTING FACILITIES RECOMMENDATIONS

As public libraries in Delaware renovate, expand or build anew, an increased footprint will impact other aspects of library operations and usage such as:

- Technology
- Staffing
- Collections
- Programming/Patron Assistance

The following sections outline additional considerations that accompany any facility upgrade. With every new construction or renovation project, it is vital to consider the lifecycle costs of building, operating and maintaining a new or expanded facility. For example, providing new Inspiration Spaces such as makerspaces will likely require new pieces of equipment, training for staff or increased staffing, which have far-reaching budgetary implications. A holistic analysis of the one-time cost of construction, coupled with an estimate for long-term operational and maintenance costs is vital to any library's continuing success.

# **TECHNOLOGY**

Delaware public libraries have made massive technological strides in the past decade. Among its many accomplishments, one of the most far-reaching is the provision of high-speed broadband internet at every library. Libraries across the state now have minimum connectivity speeds of 100Mbps, with some beginning to raise the speed to 500Mbps. As Larra Clark, director of the ALA's program on America's Libraries for the 21st Century puts it, this is "a game changer for an entire state." Undoubtedly, it is crucial to continually upgrade connection speeds.

Just as vital has been the implementation of a systemwide hardware and software replacement and maintenance program. A state-funded and managed program, computing devices and appropriate software are deployed consistently across all libraries, which are upgraded every four years, ensuring that the latest technology is deployed throughout the state. Support for the technology is also provided by the central DDL IT staff.

Another critically important advancement is the creation of a statewide technological infrastructure that manifests itself on the patron-end as the Delaware Library Catalog Consortium, which is a statewide catalog of collections across all 33 public libraries and several academic, special, and school libraries. On the library operations-end, this systemwide platform allows for the collection of live data that provides librarians with valuable information regarding user trends in terms of collections and programming needed. This platform also encourages a more collaborative workflow between librarians across the system. An important service that DDL provides is the ability to host, create and support websites for all libraries in the state, which eases the cost and staffing burden on individual libraries of maintaining an online presence.



Incorporating technology into facilities is of utmost importance given the centrality of technology to users' daily lives. As upgraded and new facilities are being planned and designed, it is important to factor in user preferences and expectations in regard to technology. Some technologies that users or librarians may want integrated into a library facility include:

# **COLLABORATION TECHNOLOGIES**

Today's technology-savvy customers expect to find gathering spaces with technologies that include computer-based collaborative stations, video conferencing, and smart boards. Computing areas that are less carrel-like, with collaborative furniture arranged to allow multiple people to work together on one screen, partnering on the creation of digital content in a group dynamic, is increasingly essential. This configuration requires additional consideration for noise and more active use as compared to a traditional computing station. These areas may need to be located away from "quiet areas," combined with web conference functions and partially separated or fully enclosed in group study rooms.

## ACCESS TO ONLINE CURRICULUM

With the proliferation of "massive open online courses" (MOOCs), Delaware libraries' websites could serve as a portal to these digital classrooms, connecting patrons to the host of classes available on the internet. Additionally, computing areas at the libraries could be configured to encourage groups of users to participate in online classes simultaneously.

# **IMPLEMENT TELEPRESENCE TECHNOLOGIES**

Incorporating telepresence technologies into library programming allows patrons to access library programs virtually, giving them greater choice in when and how they are to participate in programs. The option of engaging with programs online, is vital to serving users of all ages and abilities, increasing the library's outreach.

# **SELF-CHECKOUT**

Self-checkout technology is a popular customer service in today's public libraries. Customers appreciate the convenience of being able to check-out library materials from kiosk or self-check computers and library staff gain significant organizational efficiencies, freeing up staff to take on other library responsibilities. The technology and hardware has improved considerably over the years and can be easily installed in existing facilities with minimal disruption, providing an additional method for patrons to check items out.

# WIRELESS AND BYOD

The widespread implementation of wireless technology at Delaware public libraries has enabled more people to "Bring-Your-Own-Device (BYOD)." Without the need to be anchored to a desktop station, computing spaces can be more distributed throughout the spaces in the various libraries. An array of chair and desk combinations, locations, and access to power and wireless internet throughout each library would support BYOD. While it is important to keep in mind that some users may not have access to portable devices, this general trend may result in a decreased need for dedicated computer stations, freeing up the space for other program uses.

# OUTLETS

As more patrons bring their own devices to the library, the need for additional outlets becomes increasingly pronounced. There are many ways to provide additional power options without undertaking a major renovation project, including the use of powered furniture, power pods and other flexible products, some of which are described in greater detail in the Ideas Book.

# STATEWIDE PEOPLE COUNTING SYSTEM

Customer visit data is extremely important to understanding overall library utilization, traffic patterns within each library, and planning for staffing resources. Currently, many tallies of customer visits to libraries are a manual task. Library door counters can be designed using infrared sensor beams or overhead cameras for open areas or areas where camera security provides added value, such as children's areas or specialized technology areas. Anonymous data collection would include how many people entered the library and at what times, which rooms are used more often, etc. This new technology would support organizational efficiencies and provide data to help plan future resources and investments in services. As such, it is important that a solution is implemented consistently and enterprise-wide across all Delaware libraries.

# **SPECIALTY DIGITAL TOOLS**


As customers use their own computing devices in the libraries at an increasing rate, including laptops, tablets, and smartphones, libraries could consider providing access to peripherals and other enhancement tools that customers may need but are unlikely to have access to at home. These include music and audio devices (e.g. MIDI keyboards), Virtual Reality devices, scanners, standard print stations and/or specialty flatbed/wide media printers, and digital media editing tools (e.g. mixing control surfaces).

# DATA COLLECTION AND THE DEWEY-MASLOW FRAMEWORK

As a direct result of the Delaware public libraries' achievement with establishing a statewide platform that allows for the collection of live data, a statewide ILS and statewide calendar, the Delaware Division of Libraries has been able to measure library performance by key performance criteria since

## FIGURE 4 Delaware Public Libraries


The Dewey-Maslow Framework is used to organize library services and data and help make visible how the library processes and systems interact with in each in the library service model. Along the x-axis, subject areas are organized by the Dewey Decimal Classification system. Along the y-axis, a modified version of Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs depicts all needs ranging from basic to transformational.



2014, which include: reference questions, professional development workshops, professional development attendance, programs, program attendance, physical items and physical circulation. The data, when organized by the Dewey classification system as seen in Figure 4, is a useful tool that allows librarians to quickly spot trends. For example, the data assists with identifying subject matters with the greatest program attendance, areas with the most reference questions, topics with the greatest circulation numbers, and much more. (Figure 5) Integrating a statewide people-counting system to the current set of data will provide a fuller picture of each library's performance.

Due to the statewide platform that consolidates data regarding circulation, program activity, patron assistance etc, the public libraries in the State of Delaware are able to clearly identify trends in patron needs. Just as importantly, libraries are able to use the Dewey-Maslow framework to analyze the services they provide in relation to the needs of their immediate community and benchmark themselves against their neighboring libraries and statewide.



# **STAFFING**

The role that the Delaware public libraries play in supporting patrons on their journey of self-directed lifelong learning is immeasurable. Librarians, in particular, are key to assisting patrons in accessing the knowledge available at a library or online. Since the 2005 Statewide Master Plan, Delaware public librarians have more actively participated in and sought out professional development opportunities. One vital development is the improved access to workshops, videos and online resources for librarians that makes it more convenient for them to update or enhance their knowledge in any subject matter of their choice. Librarians play a key role in assisting patrons engage with the cycle of lifelong learning. Cultivating a culture of learning among library professionals in the first step toward "providing everyone access to the knowledge that engages their passion."

# **INCREASED STAFFING**

Anticipating the projected service population growth in Delaware, it is vital to increase staffing at the libraries to maintain the level of service that patrons have come to expect. Additionally, as this Master Plan proposes an increase to the minimum size of the three tiers of libraries, the proposed staffing levels are tied to the enlarged square footages and assume that the building is a single-story facility. (Table G) A multi-story building would require more staffing than the minimum shown. The proposed staffing levels are from an analysis of the types of program spaces desired in the proposed library facilities, an estimate of the number of hours to be spent on developing and running programs and the need to spend more time on professional development. Staffing availability is frequently tied to the time spent on transactional activities such as collections management and circulation. The recommendations in

the next few pages focus on strategies that allow staff to switch their focus from transactional activities to more strategic ones, such as increased involvement in programming, marketing and patron assistance, to name a few. Increased staffing at the county and state level to facilitate statewide coordination of Strategic Planning, Marketing/Communications, and Program and Service Coordination will allow the Delaware library system to conduct periodic online surveys and community conversations to better anticipate and meet the needs of Delawareans.

1 The ability to work with teens and tweens should be the priority requirement for this position. Ideally, the librarian would also have a Master's in Library Science (MLS).

2 If self-check is utilized, the number of Customer Services Assistant II could be reduced to 1.0 for the Regional and Anchor libraries and none for the Community Library.

- 3 If the library decides to centralize the Collection Development and Management process with other libraries, there would be a need for 1.0 Support Services Assistant at the Regional and Anchor libraries and none at the Community Library.
- 4 A Library Page would typically be able to shelve and read the shelves at a rate of 75 items per hour. The following formula determines the number of Pages needed: Annual circulation 600,000 / 75 items per hour = 8,000 hours / 2080 = 3.85 FTE.
- 5 The Building Owners Management Association (BOMA) "standard" is one full-time custodian can maintain 20,000 SF of carpeted space.

# **TYPES OF STAFFING**

Inculcating the habit of lifelong learning and visiting the library starts from an early age. Incorporating Children's and Teens' sections in every library facility provides the necessary setting for a library to be welcoming to all populations. However, it is the librarian who is central to assisting patrons in their acquisition of knowledge. The minimum recommendation is for at least one full-time professional librarian possessing a master's degree from an ALA accredited program. A Children's Services Librarian and Teen Services Librarian are essential positions for some of the larger libraries. While a Children's Services Librarian would ideally possess a Master's in Library Science, a person with a graduate or undergraduate degree in an appropriate field with experience working with children of all ages, may also be suitable. A priority requirement for a Teen Services Librarian is a Master's in Library Science and the ability to work with teens and tweens.

# **STAFF COMPENSATION**

Across the state and three counties, there is a wide disparity of staff salaries, benefits and hours worked. Though the three counties vary greatly in terms of demographics and economic conditions, the compensation in general for staff at all levels (professional librarians and support staff) is significantly below national standards. Though this report has not offered a detailed review and analysis of staff compensation, it is one that each library jurisdiction and governing body will need to strongly consider in future budgets. Library staff, at all levels, have a close connection to and interaction with a large number of Delawareans. Staff members are key in positively impacting the communities they serve in a long-lasting, far-ranging manner. Providing competitive compensation is key to continuing to attract quality, trained, experienced library staff to serve the public. (Table H)

# **PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT**

As Delaware public librarians have been actively seeking out opportunities to improve their knowledge and skill sets, fostering an environment of inquiry, curiosity and learning is becoming increasingly widespread; however, more can be done to support this development. Staff are taking on responsibilities that go beyond the transactional and are focusing on more strategic activities such as marketing, outreach, advocacy, program planning and others. To support staff in their effort to transition to these new roles, Delaware librarians have established a Statewide Professional Development Team and identified a series of priorities to focus on. The Professional Development Curriculum is part of this endeavor to augment staff training. 12 curriculum topics were developed in partnership with DDL and Delaware public librarians, covering the following topics:

- Advocacy training
- Asset Management 101
- Core Technology Skills
- Data 101
- Fostering Innovation and Creativity
- Keeping Up with Technology
- Marketing for Libraries
- Serving Underserved Populations
- Technology Planning
- Library Grants 101
- Introduction to Library Strategic Planning and Project Management
- Programming and Partnerships

A training plan, PowerPoint presentation, facilitator notes, resources and handouts were developed for the curriculum listed above.

# **DEWEY-MASLOW FRAMEWORK**

As mentioned earlier, the data collected and adapted to the Dewey-Maslow Framework provides libraries with a powerful tool to assess their services and operations. A higher program attendance or number of reference questions in a certain subject matter could be viewed as an indication to librarians to focus their professional development efforts in those areas.

# **COLLECTIONS MANAGEMENT**

Today's libraries operate in an environment in which content is packaged in an array of formats to meet patron needs. The operational and budgetary challenge of keeping a collection updated is amplified by the need to provide the content in multiple formats. In reviewing the recent successes of Delaware public libraries, two developments lay a foundation for providing a strategy forward in terms of managing collections. These developments are the Delaware Library Catalog Consortium and the statewide provision of high-speed broadband internet and computer stations.

# **STATEWIDE INTEGRATION**

The success in the rollout of high-speed internet across the state lay in the fact that it was a statewide endeavor. Building upon that success, a more holistic, systemwide approach to collections management may yield similar successes in terms of achieving an economy of scale in purchasing, while continuing to provide the mix of titles and materials that best reflect the needs of Delawareans. Centralizing the acquisition of materials at the statewide level allows vendors to anticipate higher volumes, resulting in better terms, pricing and faster order fulfillment time. While acquisition may be centralized, the selection of materials continues to occur at the local library level with librarians determining the mix of new materials that best reflects the needs and concerns of their patrons. More services could be obtained from the vendors such as cataloguing the new materials, which would be

"shelf-ready" when they arrive at the library. Relying upon third-party vendors to catalogue materials may also result in improved consistency and searchability of the system's catalogue.

By adopting this system, the overall cost of collections acquisition and number of staff hours spent could be reduced. Based on recent calculations, a statewide budget of approximately \$3 million per year would be sufficient to provide all public libraries with updated collections on a yearly basis. If new statewide funding for collections becomes available, it does not supplant local funding. Local library budgets previously dedicated to collections acquisition could be used to provide the increased staffing levels and additional local library services recommended in other sections of the Master Plan.

# **SERVICES/PATRON ASSISTANCE**

The services provided at Delaware public libraries have expanded in an impressive fashion since the Statewide Master Plan in 2005. Patrons now have myriad ways of receiving assistance on a multitude of topics and accessing information through the library. LibGuides is a platform that allows users to easily find answers to a variety of topics. The service brings together a series of guides and resources on topics ranging from early literacy, healthcare, career development, Delaware governance and legislation and more. With Ask a Librarian Delaware, users are able to text, email or call their librarian with questions. From the website, users can email questions with attached files to librarians 24/7. The proliferation of ways in which patrons can connect with librarians is truly groundbreaking.

By partnering with local agencies and non-profits, Delawareans now have access to assistance on issues ranging from career development, healthcare, welfare assistance and many more, at the library. The library has become the one-stop shop for people seeking all types of aid. By continuing to build local

Friends groups and the statewide Friends of Delaware Libraries to enhance advocacy and raise awareness of the important role that libraries play in communities across Delaware, the libraries can continue to be at the forefront of providing needed services to citizens in the state.

# **IMPACT OF THE DEWEY-MASLOW FRAMEWORK ON PATRON ASSISTANCE**

By analyzing the collected data about program offerings and attendance against the Dewey-Maslow framework, librarians will be better able to align programmed events with patron needs. In doing so, attendance at program events will likely increase, resulting in greater patron satisfaction.

# **BUDGETING FOR PROGRAMS**

As librarians become more involved in planning, organizing and conducting programs, it may become necessary for libraries to increase their focus on budgeting time and funding for these programs.

Assisting patrons with their queries

#### **HOURS OF SERVICE**

For the Community and Regional libraries the usual opening hour is 10:00 AM and the usual closing hour is either 6:00 PM or 8:00 PM. For the Anchor libraries they are recommended to open one hour earlier and stay open one hour later on most days.


Community libraries are recommended to be open six days a week – Monday – Saturday for a total of 56 hours per week. Regional libraries open seven days a week for a total of 67 weekly hours of service. Anchor libraries also open seven days for a weekly total of 72 service hours.

# **NEXT STEPS**

Since the 2005 Master Plan, Delaware public libraries have embarked on a transformative process that has propelled them to the forefront in some areas, notably in the areas of high-speed connectivity, access to technology, statewide integrated platforms, and others. It is essential to continue building upon that momentum of progress and enhance the visionary mindset in other areas, so that the public libraries remain essential to the lives of everyday Delawareans. The following lists some tangible, concrete goals that librarians could aim for in setting aspirations for their libraries.

#### **BIG PICTURE GOALS FOR DELAWARE PUBLIC LIBRARIES**

- Find people who have never been to the library to walk through your library and ask them for their first impressions
- Use the DDL facilities staff to assist in early planning or programming for facility improvements
- Provide additional power sources for customers to charge their devices
- Make at least one physical change per year in your library
- Use DDL web-template services
- Promote a "culture of learning" among library staff
- Encourage staff participation in professional development opportunities
- Adopt the usage of the Dewey-Maslow framework in assessing library performance and guiding service developments

#### **BIG PICTURE GOALS FOR DELAWARE DIVISION OF LIBRARIES**

- Create guidelines and budget to deploy a statewide system for purchasing and managing all print collections
- Obtain budget
  - o to implement facilities renovation and expansion proposal for the next ten years
  - o to deploy at least one self-check equipment at each library
  - o to deploy a statewide door counting system
- Support a system-wide "culture of learning" among all libraries
- Identify and encourage greater integration with local partners




